The Reach of an Open Christian Home

No one is more of a product of the witness of a Christian Home than my family. Towards the end of WWII, my Dad (Irving Skaar) was a 15 year old G.I. from Brooklyn, NY, the 6th child born to Norwegian immigrants, and serving our country building barracks at a San Antonio Army Air Corps base (later renamed Lackland AFB). Each weekend, the

families of Riverside Baptist Church in San Antonio would send their church bus to pick up any G.I.s who were able to obtain weekend leave. Whether my Dad was just an exceptional soldier, or his commanding officer just wanted him off the base, Dad was always the first on the bus seemingly earning leave every weekend. The Christian home he stayed in was with the Simpson Family - Berry Simpson's Grandparents' home. It was at Riverside Baptist Church in San Antonio, while staying in the home of the Simpsons, that my Dad made his public profession in Jesus Christ His Savior, followed by Baptism to join the fellowship of our Lord's Church at Riverside Baptist. The testimony to our Lord that my Dad witnessed, spending weekends in the home of the Simpson family, provided an example my Dad followed for his family. As a teenager living in Humble (NE Houston), we always had international students studying in Houston staying in our home every holiday. For almost all, the Skaar home was the first Christian home they had ever stayed in. As teenagers, our home was always open to our friends not only in high school, but we were encouraged to bring home any friend from college who didn't have a place to go for any break or holiday. Even after college, I'm surprised to find out how many of my friends stayed at the Skaar home while looking for jobs in Houston or waiting on their first paychecks to be able to afford to rent a place of their own. Today - and for the foreseeable future our Lord has blessed Midland and the Permian Basin with the resources to be an economic cornerstone of the Petroleum Industry. The World is coming to Midland not only to work, but to learn and train in the advanced techniques necessary to commercially produce unconventional reserves. This boom has provided each of us opportunities to open our homes for those in need. One such need coming up is our local missions partner Rock the Desert.

I am John Hatch missionary/church planter on the Stoney Nakoda Indian Reserve at Morley, Alberta Canada. The Rez is 40 miles west of Calgary. There are about 5,000 people on the

Reserve. I am still in the foundational stage of building relationships with people and learning the culture, however I am hoping to begin having public worship services soon.

In order to meet people and build relationships I volunteer at the Food Bank, day care, women's shelter and tutor 4th grade math at the elementary school. I'm also working with the Chief to build an Arts & Crafts workshop where people work on projects to be sold in our store to provide income for the people. Gas in Calgary is \$4/gallon (U.S.). Thank you for your support which helps me pay for gas to travel the 40 miles to the Rez every day.
