THANKSGIVING DINNER IS ONE WEEK AWAY

November 18th at 5 PM, we'll celebrate our First Family Thanksgiving. You can get a ticket for \$6 at church this weekend. Purchasing a ticket in advance really helps our kitchen staff prepare well for the event.

THE GIFT

The response we had Sunday to adopting children for "The Gift" was overwhelming! We adopted EVERY CHILD AVAILABLE! I know this is a different way of doing our Christmas outreach, but thanks for jumping in with us just the same. I thought I'd take my article today to explain all of these moving parts.

Why are we doing "The Gift"?

To proclaim the gracious gift of Christ to the Midland community. Giving them gifts is ancillary to our missional purpose.

What are the dates of "The Gift"?

December 7-8 are the dates when we will present the gifts to the families.

Where are we doing "The Gift"?

We are holding this event in the Fellowship Hall.

What about "White Harvest" boxes? Are we still doing those?

Yes. Beginning Sunday, November 18th, we'll have the "White Harvest" boxes set out for you to pick up and pack. The list of contents hasn't changed – it still should be around \$30 to fill it according to our prescribed list. Those boxes – as always – will be given to the families receiving gifts.

Are we still doing the "Living Nativity"?

Yes. We have moved it inside and have added dramatic monologues to it. Our vision is to give people a better understanding of what they're seeing. The Living Nativity presentation will conclude with a Gospel presentation inviting people to respond to Christ.

Why aren't we doing "Living Nativity" for the community?

We are – on Sunday, December 2, before we do the presentations for our guests with "The Gift", we'll welcome the community to see the performance at 5 and 7 PM in the auditorium. We need YOUR help to get people there.

How will "The Gift" work for our guests? What is our process for getting the gifts into their hands?

Our guests will be assigned a time for Dec 7 or 8. When they arrive, they'll begin at the "Living Nativity" in the chapel. The presentation will last about 45 minutes, ending with a Gospel presentation. From there, they'll be escorted down the hallways to the Fellowship Hall. The children will be taken to the D-hallway for a "Happy Birthday Jesus" party. The adults will be taken to the Fellowship Hall to have their gifts wrapped. My vision is for our guests to hear the Gospel again from their gift-wrappers unless there is a language barrier. Once their gifts are wrapped, they'll be reunited with their children and helped out the door where they'll receive their White Harvest box.

What are our needs?

We need gift-wrappers. We need parking lot delivery people. We need people who can help with the "Happy Birthday Jesus" party. Most of all, we need people passionate about connecting our community with the Gospel of Jesus Christ that they can celebrate Christmas in a way they never have before.

Is there something to invite our "Gift" friends to at the end?

Yes – our Christmas musical "The King is Coming" is Sunday, December 9th at 6 PM.

Why did we make all these changes?

Our vision was to improve on what we were already doing and to simplify December. It might not look like it, but as we (The Gift leadership committee led by Linda Freeman and your ministry team) looked at the December calendar, it was bloated and crowded. While the week of "The Gift" will be busy, it will be our last major weekend until Christmas Eve, leaving our departments and classes plenty of time for fellowships and parties.

We also wanted to be able to communicate the Gospel more effectively in all areas. For example, with the "Living Nativity," we once could count on a general understanding of the Christmas story and the characters involved. That's sadly not true anymore. Our desire is to keep this wonderful tradition alive and compel it forward by clarifying the Christ of Christmas in drama.

All told, please know my heart. We wouldn't make these changes just to confuse or complicate things. My passion is for people to connect with Christ (not just at Christmas, but especially then!) and see their lives changed by Him. Will you pray with me to this end?
